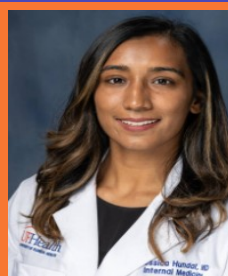
Aditi Patel, PGY-1

- Favorite vacation spot (pre-COVID)? "Tahiti, never been but I hear good things"



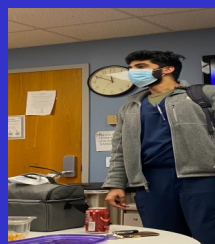

- Valproic Acid

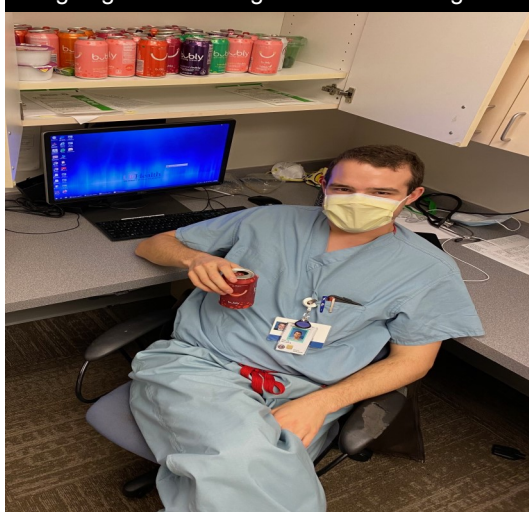

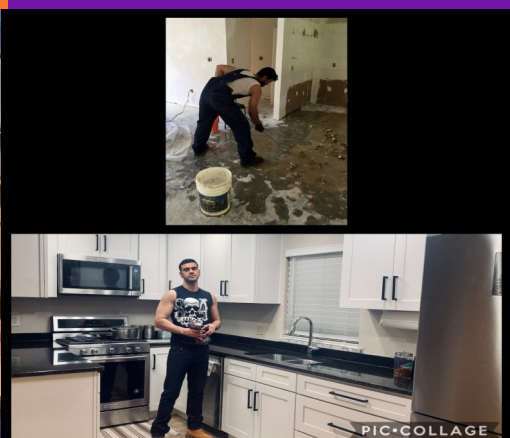
